• *Celebration of World Book Day with Niamh Sharkey*



We were delighted to have Niamh Sharkey join us this year to mark the beginning of the celebration of World Book Day.

WELL-BEING WEEK 25TH March

Seachtain na Gaeilge was a great success again this year. Lots of activities took place in every classroom. Each class had an Irish Dancing lesson with Mrs. Keane. Junior classes were treated to a concert of Irish music from some of our past pupils who are now in the Senior School, while musicians from the Community College played for an appreciative audience of 1st and 2nd class pupils and answered questions about learning music. Ms. Warnock & Ms. Meehan played a short recital on fiddle & concertina and Ms. Ní Chróinín sang a couple of songs for the children. A gentle reminder that scooters/bikes/Flikrs etc must be collected before or after children are brought to the gate to avoid the accidents and injuries that can be caused by a child trying to steer a bike or scooter through crowds of children at collection times.
